

THE STEVE BURCHYNS SCHOLARSHIP

The Steve Burchyns Scholarship provides an annual award to a child, grandchild, or step-child of a DSS Special Agent, active, retired or deceased. Applicants with a 2.8 (B-) average in high school and strong SAT or ACT scores may apply. Deadline for applications is March 1. Awards will begin at approximately \$1,500 and may increase annually with the growth of the fund. The scholarship is renewable each year, through the fourth year at John Carroll, assuming the student continues satisfactory academic performance.

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

1. A student must apply and be accepted for admission to John Carroll University as a full-time undergraduate student. **Deadline for application is March 1.**
2. A student is required to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) according to the normal timetable.
