

John Carroll University Andrew McCarthy Scholarship

Established in 1984 for Andrew “Dewey” McCarthy, class of 1981, who was tragically killed in a car accident in 1983, this scholarship was designed as a “living memorial” to Dewey and is earmarked for an incoming freshman at John Carroll University every year. Dewey, from Boston, Massachusetts, was a soccer player and a member of Iota Beta Gamma service fraternity.

It is a four-year scholarship of \$2,500 annually, renewable each year, which recognizes a student’s overall leadership, citizenship and academic ability. The recipient will be reviewed each year and the scholarship renewed if the recipient demonstrates involvement in extracurricular activities. The student must maintain a minimum 2.5 G.P.A.

Qualifications for this Scholarship

- * Students must apply and be admitted to John Carroll University.
- * Students must show significant involvement in extracurricular activities and evidence of leadership.
- * Students must have a high school minimum G.P.A. of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, or graduate in the top 25% of their class.
- * Students must demonstrate leadership qualities while at John Carroll through participation in extracurricular activities at the university or within the community.

It is the intent of the scholarship committee to choose an individual who will display outstanding leadership and citizenship capabilities both during and after his/her four years at John Carroll University.

Application Procedure

1. Fill out the enclosed questionnaire.
2. Type a 250-300 word essay explaining what your expectations are of John Carroll and how the University will benefit from your involvement.
3. An interview may be set-up with a member of the selection committee for the five (5) finalists.
4. A decision on the scholarship recipient will be made by May 1st.
