ETHICS (FULL)**Guidelines for Course Development Grants**

The Summer Ethics Course Development Fellowship provides a stipend for course development work during the Summer. The purpose of the Fellowship is to provide support to faculty to design and implement new courses on the ethics of their discipline. Fellowship recipients may teach only one course during the Summer and must devote the other time to their course development projects. All full-time tenured or tenure-track faculty are eligible to apply. The stipends have a \$3,500 value.

The award period must begin after commencement in May and ends with the beginning of the Fall Semester. Recipients are required to submit a written report on the results of the award including a completed syllabus, list of materials and bibliography. There should also be a plan to evaluate the course. The report should be submitted to the Associate AVP for Academic Programs and Faculty Diversity following the award period. Courses which are developed are expected to be offered during the following academic year.

Applications should be made on the “Summer Course Development Fellowship” form available in the Office of The Academic Vice President and WWW.JCU.EDU/AVP/FD.

Deadline for applications is **Monday, February 7, 2011**.
