JESUIT (PARTIAL)**Guidelines for Course Development Grants**

The Partial Summer Jesuit Course Development Fellowship offered through the Institute for Catholic Studies provides a stipend for the summer to revise currently-existing courses by integrating a Jesuit component into them. The purpose of the Fellowship is to encourage faculty to restructure their courses to include the ethical issues which arise in their discipline.

This Fellowship is a partial fellowship; recipients are expected to complete their project during the period beginning after commencement in May and ending with the start of Fall Semester. All full-time tenured or tenure-track faculty are eligible to apply. The stipends have a \$1,000 value.

Candidates for the fellowship must have a proven track record for excellence in teaching. To ensure that the course will be taught, the candidate must submit a letter from the chairperson of their department supporting the idea, indicating the value of the course for the department, and guaranteeing that the course will be offered during the next academic year.

Recipients will be required to submit a written report on the results of the grant including a completed syllabus, list of materials and bibliography. The report should be submitted to the Associate Academic Vice President for Academic Programs and Faculty Diversity by October 1 following the award period. A copy of the report must also be submitted to the Director of the Institute of Catholic Studies.
