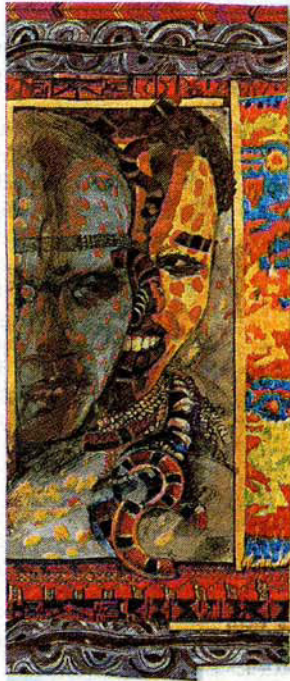

It's believed widely that manuscript illumination vanished after Gutenberg and the rise of mechanical reproduction. Not so. From 2 to 5 p.m. Sunday, John Carroll University will hold a brief exhibition to celebrate the gift of a rare, high quality reproduction of a Bible created by a team of contemporary calligraphers under the auspices of St. John's Abbey and University and monastery in Collegeville, Minn. The show will consist of the first of seven volumes to be donated to the university, plus four original pages illuminated by Donald Jackson, the master calligrapher who has led the project. Target, the retail company, made the gift from St. John's to John Carroll University possible through a donation in honor of John Carroll alumnus John Pellegrine, a retired Target vice president.
