

COMPLETER RATES*

Undergraduate Candidate Rates, Initial Licensure

The following table (Table 1) shows the completion rates for undergraduate teacher candidates. Undergraduate students are traditionally admitted to the Teacher Education (TE) program in their sophomore year. On average, 69% of candidates completed within 2 years of the cohort year they were admitted to TE, and 86% of candidates completed within 4 years of their cohort admission year. Of the non-completing candidates, 100% voluntarily withdrew from the program, clinical experience, or university.

Graduate Candidate Rates, Initial Licensure (School-Based and Professional Teacher)

The following tables show the completion rates for graduate teacher candidates. Graduate students enter either: the **M.Ed. School-based program** (Table 2), which is an 11-month intensive initial licensure program (but candidates have up to 5 years to complete the degree); or, the **M.Ed. professional teacher initial licensure program** (Table 3), wherein candidates have up to 5 years to complete the program requirements. The average completion rate for the School-based candidates is 83% within 11 months; the average completion rate for M.Ed. initial licensure candidates is 63% within 5 years. Of those not completing the program, 100% voluntarily withdrew from the program, clinical experience, or university.

Graduate Candidate Rates, Advanced Licensure (School Psychology)

The following table (Table 4) shows the program completion rates for the School Psychology advanced licensure program. At the completion of this 3-year program, candidates earn a license in School Psychology and a M.Ed./Ed.S. degree. Candidates do have up to 5 years to complete the program if needed. The average completion rate is 100% within 3 years. *School Psychology Advanced Licensure will have the last cohort graduate Spring 2023. Program no longer accepting admissions after Fall 2020.

Graduate Candidate Rates, Advanced Licensure (Educational Leadership)

The Educational Leadership program is an advanced licensure program leading to a M.Ed. degree, Assessment Certificate, and eligibility for principal licensure. The program is designed to be a 2-year program, but candidates have up to 5 years to complete the degree. The Educational Leadership program at John Carroll University admitted its first cohort of candidates in Fall 2018, with a projected initial graduation date of May 2020. Completion rate data is in Table 5 below.
