

Federal Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education Grant Program (TEACH Grant)

What is the TEACH Grant?

The TEACH Grant provides up to \$4000 an academic year, to be prorated for less than full-time enrollment, up to a lifetime maximum of \$8000 for grant assistance to graduate students completing certain course work in teaching.

In exchange for the grant, a student must sign an agreement to serve as a full-time teacher at certain low-income schools* within certain high-need fields** for at least <u>four</u> academic years within eight years after completing (or ceasing enrollment in) the course of study for which the candidate received the TEACH Grant.

TEACH Grant recipients must submit evidence of employment as certified by the chief administrative officer of the school upon completion of each year of teaching service.

If the grant recipient fails or refuses to carry out their teaching obligation, the amount of the TEACH Grants received are treated as an unsubsidized Direct Loan and must be repaid with interest accruing from the date of grant disbursement(s).

Who can get this grant?

As set forth by John Carroll University

 Graduate Students enrolled in the School Based Master of Education Program or the Professional Teacher Initial Licensure Program

What are the eligibility requirements?

Be above the 75th percentile on one part of the GRE admission test (requirement waived for current or former teachers), or

 Have at least a 3.25 cumulative GPA for each TEACH Grant payment period (requirement waived for current or former teachers)

How do I apply?

- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) https://studentaid.gov/h/apply-for-aid/fafsa
- Sign and file with JCU Student Enrollment and Financial Services an Agreement to Serve in schools serving low-income students * and in a high-need field**
